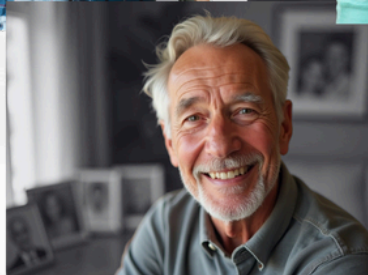

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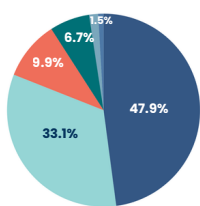
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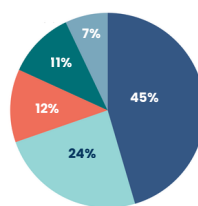

A Message from our CEO and Board President

Dear Friends,

It is nearly impossible to capture all that 2025 brought to Jewish Family Services of Delaware (JFS) in just a few paragraphs. The year was marked by service, transition, resilience, and remembrance.

We experienced profound loss with the **passing of RISE Director Jenevive Newman**, whose impact on our organization and community will continue to be felt for years to come. At the same time, we celebrated important milestones, including the **opening of new offices in Newark and Lewes** and our first-ever **participation in the Highmark Walk** for a Healthy Community. Throughout the year, some members of our team moved on to new opportunities, while others joined us or stepped into new leadership roles. Changes in the federal administration also brought shifts in policy and funding, creating both uncertainty and new challenges to navigate.

Through every transition, the dedicated professionals at JFS remained grounded in the values that guide our work each day. Inspired by our shared responsibility to repair the world (Tikkun Olam), pursue justice through charity and service (Tzedakah), and honor the inherent dignity of every human being created in the image of G-d (B'tzelem Elohim), we faced 2025 with compassion, resilience, and kindness (Chesed). These values continue to shape the services we provide and strengthen the individuals, families, and communities we are privileged to serve.

In 2025, JFS proudly advanced its mission by:

- Impacting 3,278 individuals through our programs and services.
- Expanding the Cancer Care Connection team to meet growing community needs
- Offering Youth Anxiety and Maternal Mental Health support groups
- Providing food support to 595 individuals through our food pantry
- Launching Grief Yoga and Bereavement Support Groups to help individuals navigate loss

These efforts translated into increased access to care, reduced isolation, and stronger mental health outcomes for individuals and families across our community.

To our staff and volunteers: thank you. Your commitment, compassion, and tireless service are the foundation of everything JFS accomplishes. Our work would not be possible without you.

And to those we serve: thank you for allowing us to be part of your journey. You are an essential part of JFS's story and an enduring part of our family. We remain honored to stand beside you and ready to support you in the years ahead.

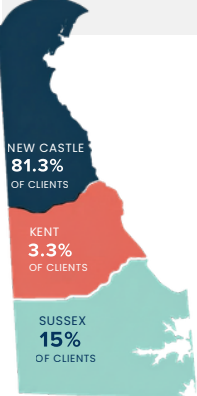

Outpatient Behavioral Health (OBH) & Psychiatry Outcomes

JFS serves individuals regardless of income or insurance status, with 55% of our counseling and psychiatry clients receiving Medicaid, food benefits (SNAP), and/or school lunch.

 **63%** of clients experienced a decrease in postnatal depression, with peer support from other moms facing similar challenges helping to reduce the stigma surrounding mental health during and after pregnancy.

Family Service Intervention

In 2025, JFS Delaware provided family service intervention support to **301 clients in Carrcroft, Shortlidge, and Silver Lake Elementary Schools**, equipping students and families with the tools, resources, and support needed to improve academic success, strengthen family relationships, and build resilience.

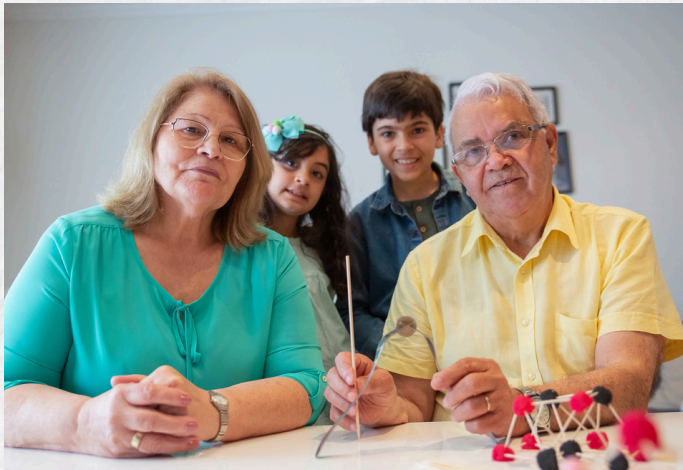

"JFS Delaware Saved My Life"



When Advocacy Saves Lives

One day, a father was preparing for open-heart surgery. The next, the procedure was abruptly halted because he lacked both health insurance and documented immigration status.

Terrified and overwhelmed, his wife contacted JFS Delaware for help.

Our staff immediately mobilized — coordinating with Medicaid representatives, hospital administrators, Delaware DHSS, and congressional offices to prevent a potentially life-threatening delay in care.

After relentless advocacy and coordination, the hospital agreed to proceed with the surgery.

"If I didn't have someone fighting for my life, I don't think I would still be here."

Today, he is recovering at home surrounded by children, grandchildren, and great-grandchildren who nearly lost someone at the center of their family.

Cancer Care Connection (CCC) Outcomes

In 2025, JFS Delaware's oncology social workers provided professional coaching, personalized information, and resource connections to 105 people affected by cancer.



A Note from a Cancer Care Connection Client

There was a point during my cancer journey when it felt like my entire life was unraveling faster than I could hold it together.

Therapy through Cancer Care Connection became one of the only places where I felt safe enough to admit how badly I was struggling.

Over time, I began learning ways to manage my anxiety instead of letting it control me.

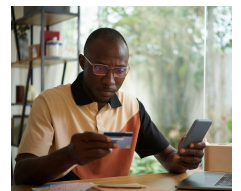
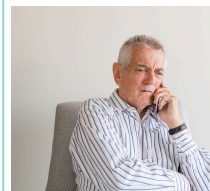
My journey is far from over, but today I can say, thanks to JFS Delaware, I am moving forward with greater strength and hope for my future.
